I started my own 501-c3 for those in need called Station WBVS, Inc. Station = a WWII hospital and WBVS = my Father, Wayne Barney's Vital Signs. We started as a DBA 4/2009, and then went to a 501-c3.

Our Mission statement is to enrich the lives of others affected by adverse actions or conditions. We hope to further the scope of learning in leadership roles, assisting where needed those adversely affected by current world affairs.

We opened a music instrument lending library for the Watertown City School Children for families that can't afford to rent equipment. I keep in contact with some of the Roosevelt family and work with some of the recipients and their presenters. I have the obligation of taking the information given to me to do research on past colleges, interests, etc. then contact people and invite them to the event. I have the honor of calling people in Paris, Spain, Iraq, etc. If you would please take a moment to look @ the list of people who have received medals you will be amazed. I have been involved since the year 2000. I also, have the great privilege to ask people if they would like to sponsor or purchase tickets - and sometimes they throw in a few thousand dollars. What a hoot!!!!!

Communicable Disease Investigation & Prevention

One of the major roles of Jefferson County Public Health Service is to investigate diseases that spread between people. Although physicians have primary responsibility for reporting communicable diseases to the county health department, school nurses, lab directors, infection control practitioners, daycare center directors, health care facilities, state institutions and any other individuals/locations providing health care services are also required to report. Once our "disease detectives" get information about a possible or confirmed case, the investigation begins. We also provide education about these diseases and how to prevent them; including handwashing - one of the best ways to protect yourself from getting sick!



According to data collected in 2017, 7.6% of adults in Jefferson County have been diagnosed with diabetes. Although there are many more who have not yet been diagnosed. In addition, the CDC estimates that 1 in 3 adults has prediabetes, but 90% of those people don't know they have it. Not only is diabetes a leading cause of death in the U.S., but it also the #1 cause for kidney failure, lower-limb amputation & adult-onset blindness.

Fight the Flu

Flu is a potentially serious, contagious disease. It can cause mild to severe illness - flu can lead to hospitalization and even death. CDC recommends a three-step approach to fight flu:

1. Get a flu vaccine. Everyone 6 months & older should get a flu vaccine by the end of October. Getting a flu vaccine every year provides the best protection against flu.

- 2. Take everyday actions to stop the spread of germs. Try to avoid close contact with sick people, and if you become sick, limit your contact with others. Cover your nose & mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze, and wash your hands often.
- 3. Take flu antiviral drugs if your doctor prescribes them. If you get sick with flu, they can be used to treat flu illness. Antiviral drugs can make illness milder & shorten the time you are sick. They may prevent serious flu complications.





Childhood Lead Poisoning

In 2017, 237 children in Jefferson
County had an elevated blood lead
level. Lead poisoning can cause
problems with a child's growth,
behavior and ability to learn.
Young children often put toys,
fingers, and other objects in their
mouth as part of their
normal development. This may
put them in contact with lead
paint or dust. That's why every
child in New York State needs to
be tested for lead poisoning at
ages 1 and 2. Talk with your child's
doctor about lead testing.
