BACK TO SCHOOL VACCINES

Summer is here! But it's not too early to make sure your kids are up-to-date on their vaccines. Getting children all of the vaccines recommended by the CDC is one of the most important things parents can do to help protect their children's health—and that of their classmates and their community. Most schools require children to be current on vaccination. Today's childhood vaccines protect against serious and potentially life-threatening diseases, including polio, measles, whooping cough, and chickenpox. When children are not vaccinated, they are at increased risk of disease and can spread diseases to others in their classrooms and community—including babies who are too young to be fully vaccinated, and people with weakened immune systems due to cancer and other health conditions. August is National Immunization Awareness Month (NIAM) too.

School age children need vaccines: For example, kids who are 4 to 6 years old are due for boosters of four vaccines: DTaP (diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis); Varicella (chickenpox); MMR (measles, mumps, and rubella), polio.

Older children, like pre-teens and teens, need other vaccines: Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis); HPV (human papillomavirus); MenACWY (meningococcal conjugate virus)

And yearly flu vaccines are recommended for all children 6 months and older.

Beat the back-to-school rush! Don't wait until August—check with your child's doctor now to find out what vaccines they need.

Breastfeeding

The American Academy of Pediatrics states: breastfeeding is the best source of nutrition through the first year of life and recommend exclusively breastfeeding for the first six months of a baby's life, and then gradually adding solid foods while continuing breastfeeding until at least the baby's first birthday. Breastfeeding has many benefits to mom and baby. Breastmilk is easier for baby to digest, doesn't need to be prepared, is always available, has all the nutrients, calories, and fluids your baby needs to be healthy, has growth factors that ensure the best development of your baby's organs, and protects your baby from many diseases and infections. Breastfeeding helps return mom's uterus to the size it was before pregnancy more quickly, helps burn more calories (which may help mom lose the weight gained during pregnancy), reduces the risk of ovarian cancer and breast cancer, and keeps bones strong, which helps protect against bone fractures in older age. Comments: June/2018, and the 2d Quarter 2018 Total Contacts, Total Services and the combined Claims figures are all higher than the same periods in 2017.
