Legislator Jareo ask if there had been any more discussion or movement concerning the use of Bed Tax funds to relieve some of the tourism deficits caused by the high water along the Lake and River shore, and to correct the misnomer that the County is not at full strength in terms of

He said the three counties will be pooling resources and will also receive New York State funding for this year and next year. Legislator Jareo asked when we can expect to see some of that advertising. Mr. Hagemann stated that there has not been any TV spots, most of the advertising has gone out on social media so far, but he could probably get a copy and forward it to legislators if they want to see it.

Chairman Gray reminded legislators of the concert and fireworks in Thompson Park tomorrow evening beginning at 6:00 p.m., and wished everyone a safe and happy July 4th holiday.
