Records (LGS-1), will supersede and replace: • CO-2 Retention Schedule for use by counties (2006), and

Whereas, Local governments must adopt LGS-1 prior to utilizing it, even if they previously adopted and have been using the CO-2, and governing boards of local governments will have a five-month period between August 1, 2020 when LGS-1 is issued and January 1, 2021 when the current CO-2 schedule expires, to adopt the Schedule by resolution, and

Whereas, Local government records may not be legally destroyed after the end of 2020 unless the LGS-1 is formally adopted.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, By the Board of Legislators for Jefferson County, NY that *Retention and Disposition Schedule for New York Local Government Records (LGS-1)*, issued pursuant to Article 57-A of the Arts and Cultural Affairs Law, and containing legal minimum retention periods for local government records, is hereby adopted for use by all officers in legally disposing of valueless records listed therein, and be it further

Resolved, that in accordance with Article 57-A:

- (a) Only those records will be disposed of that are described in *Retention and Disposition Schedule for New York Local Government Records (LGS-1)*, after they have met the minimum retention periods described therein, and

Election Commissioner Jude Seymour said the grant will allow them to do some things to make their life easier with absentee ballots and do some things for the health and safety of the voters and the inspectors at the poll sites. He said a majority of the grant will go toward cleaning of the 43 poll sites across Jefferson County as cleaning will be done before and after the election; they are purchasing an electric letter opener so absentee ballots can be opened faster and therefore tallied and reported faster to the State; and they are printing more absentee ballots as requests have increased over past volumes. They are also working on getting a drop box placed outside the County Building for absentee ballots, similar to what the DMV has, but that may not come to fruition before the election.

Resolution No. 192

Authorizing the Use of Capital Chargebacks in Relation to Debt Service Costs of a \$3,500,000 Maintenance and Revitalization Bond for Jefferson Community College

Whereas, The 2014-15 Jefferson Community College Budget did not include an increase in County funding for its operating costs and the College desired to pursue funding for various maintenance and revitalization projects through a bond, to be matched by the State of New York, and

Whereas, Pursuant to Resolution 228 of 2014, This Board of Legislators committed to providing up to \$100,000 annually for debt service on a bond of up to \$3,500,000 for an estimated term of 15 years for various maintenance and revitalization projects at Jefferson Community College, and

Whereas, Said Resolution 228 recognized that the College's Faculty/Student Association (FSA) and the College Foundation would both also contribute to the debt service costs, with each of the three entities paying approximately \$100,000 per year for the debt service costs for an estimated total of \$4,500,000 including interest, and

Whereas, Pursuant to Resolution 109 of 2016, This Board amended the County Capital Plan and reiterated its commitment to providing up to \$100,000 annually, along with the College's FSA and Foundation having committed to contributing to the remaining costs of the debt service, and

Whereas, The College's intention was actually to provide the two-thirds share from capital chargebacks, with the FSA and Foundation annual payments to the College for operating expenses being committed only to the extent that capital chargebacks might fall short of the debt service costs in any given year, and

Whereas, Debt was actually issued in two different bonds with debt service stretching over 21 years and with lower interest than originally estimated for a total actual cost of \$4,227,928.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, That This Board of Legislators commits to paying one-third of the annual debt service costs with the College responsible for the remaining two-thirds with a total cost of \$4,227,928, and be it further

Resolved, That This Board authorizes the College's use of Capital Chargebacks for this purpose.

Resolution No. 206

Authorizing Settlement of Claims Relative to County of Jefferson v. Onondaga Development, LLC

Whereas, A lawsuit entitled "County of Jefferson v. Onondaga Development, LLC", Index No. 2011-0025, is pending in Jefferson County Supreme Court regarding various claims and counter claims; and

Whereas, On the advice of counsel after the consideration of the documentary evidence and legal analysis of the claim and counterclaim, and that a negotiated settlement is, as a matter of litigation analysis and risk management, a cost-effective alternative to full trial of the action; and

Whereas, Counsel has advised that the range of possible verdicts includes the possibility of a verdict of "no cause for action," but also may include an adverse verdict in an amount which is in the discretion of the jury and which may exceed the current settlement demand of Onondaga Development; and

Whereas, The Substantial costs of proceeding to trial—including both the labor and opportunity costs of making senior employees of the County available throughout the trial; the costs of attorney preparation and presentation of trial; and the costs to be incurred for our expert witnesses in preparing for and testifying at trial may equal or exceed the amount of the proposed settlement; at the same time that a settlement defines the extent of expense and removes the threat of uncapped exposure; and

Whereas, Pursuant to Local Law No. 5 of 1986, a settlement or comprise of a claim in the amount of \$10,000.00 or greater requires the prior approval of the Board of Legislators,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That for purposes of avoiding the costs and expense of a trial; and for purposes of compromising a claim at a point well within the estimated range of possible jury verdicts and direct and indirect costs of the process, the Board of Legislators does hereby agree to a settlement of the matter herein; and the sum of One Hundred Twenty Six Thousand Dollars (\$126,000.00) be and hereby is appropriated from Account: 45-9022-1930.4600, the Judgment and Claims Fund, for purposes of settling the referenced litigation against the County of Jefferson; in consideration of the above payment, Onondaga Development will convey certain real property to the County of Jefferson by warranty deed with lien release, if necessary, located on tax map parcel number 82.08-1-3 in the Town of Watertown constituting approximately 0.20 acres. Upon closing of the conveyance, receipt of a Release of all claims in a form acceptable to

the County Attorney, and receipt of a fully executed Stipulation of Discontinuance, the County Attorney is hereby authorized to tender that sum to counsel for the Onondaga Development, upon such terms and conditions as counsel agree.
