Whereas, the County has no further purpose in maintaining possession of the parcel.

Authorizing the Implementation and Funding in the First Instance 100% of the Federal Aid and State "Marchiselli" Program Aid Eligible Costs of a Transportation Federal-Aid Project (CR 97 and Brown Road over Fish Creek), Appropriating Funds Therefore and Amending the 2021 County Budget and Capital Plan

Whereas, Avalon Associates has also proposed, if a CDBG grant is awarded, to develop the housing program and assist in grant administration for a lump sum of \$15,000 (eligible grant expense); provide program delivery services (e.g., qualifying applicants; inspecting properties; preparing loan and construction documents) for \$2,250 per housing unit (eligible grant expense); and fixed general and grant administration services fees as authorized by the grant program (eligible grant expense).

Legislator McBride said he would not support the resolution as after listening to Community Services Director Ruetten's presentation last week the prices charged for the services provided seem outrageous for both the individual as well as the taxpayer, but it didn't seem like we have much choice but to pay the bill.

Legislator Peck agreed that this is yet another program cost passed down by New York State with little or no justification for the expense or the policy, and it should be examined and corrected at the State level. He said it really is an injustice to the taxpayer and the person in the situation, and he would begrudgingly support the resolution but also wanted to work with the Community Services Department and what ever State agency Mr. Ruetten works with to enlighten the State as to the fallacy of this policy and the way they do business.

Legislator Jareo said he would not support the resolution, is sick of the mandates from the State

that are crippling our taxpayers, and we need to take a stand. He understood that at the end of the day that we will end up paying the bill, but it is worth the a message to Albany to vote some of these things down, even if it costs us some money in litigation, in order to have our voice heard.

Chairman Gray said he and other appropriate signatories could write a letter to the State articulating the concerns expressed by Board members tonight.
