Authorizing Agreement with Jefferson County Industrial Development Agency in Relation to the American Rescue Plan Act

Whereas, By Resolution 40, this Board of Legislators allocated American Rescue Plan Act funding to the Jefferson County Industrial Development Agency (JCIDA) for certain programs, and

Whereas, That allocation included \$1,000,000 for PCB remediation at 146 Arsenal Street, which turned out to require much more extensive demolition to accomplish than originally expected, and

Whereas, This Board desires to allocate funding to restore the building to its pre-PCB remediation state.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the County of Jefferson shall enter into an agreement with the JCIDA for restoration of the 146 Arsenal Street building, specifically:

- Restore Studio B, Restrooms, Electrical and Data Rooms, bottom 4 feet of exterior wall framing.
- Restore the 14,000 square foot unimproved area: exterior walls, flooring, lighting and restroom

and be it further

Resolved, That the County of Jefferson shall provide \$880,000 from American Rescue Plan Act funds to the JCIDA for services so provided under the agreement, and be it further

Resolved, That the Chairman of the Board of Legislators be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute such agreement, subject to approval of the County Administrator and County Attorney as to form and content, and be it further

Resolved, That JCIDA shall refund to the County any unobligated funds remaining once all assigned tasks have been fully completed no later than December 31, 2024, and be it further

Resolved, That at any time as the Board of Legislators may request, the JCIDA shall report in writing to this body a detailed statement of work and transactions completed in such form as it may direct.

Authorizing Inter-Municipal Agreement with the City of Watertown Regarding Coffeen Street Construction Project

Whereas, The City of Watertown has identified a need to preserve the long term integrity of Coffeen Street from the western city line to Massey Street, Massey Street from Court Street bridge to Holcomb Street, and the Court Street bridge, and

Whereas, There is a need to construct asphalt, sidewalks and sidewalk ramps that impact the intersection of Coffeen Street and the main entrance to Jefferson Community College, which property is owned by Jefferson County, and

Whereas, New York State and Federal Highway Aid is available for the project and requires the City to have an agreement in place for construction activity on all property not owned by the City, and

Whereas, The County will be required to assume ownership of all improvements following project construction.

Legislator Ferris made a motion to amend the resolution to remove the portions of this resolution for the Children's Home, the motion was seconded by Legislator Maxon.

Community Services Director Tim Reutten understood where legislators concerns were coming from and said the Children's Home has multiple programs and funding streams, and the negative issues are not with the mental health programs. He said the Community Clinic of Jefferson County serves 2,000 vulnerable individuals and with a few other programs is part of the treatment continuum in Jefferson County. He said the OMH allocation is pass through funding that is specifically a cost of living adjustment directly distributed to front line mental health staff. He said it is an initiative of New York State and a necessary piece to help retain and recruit staff and he did not know what would happen if it didn't go through.

Legislator Doldo understood where Legislator Ferris was coming from in terms of issues with the Children's Home but said we need to think things through further because he did not want Jefferson County clients or staff members helping people in the community to suffer for this. He said he will support the resolution, and discussions with the Children's Home on foster care issues will be handled separately.

Legislator Maxon said he would not support the amendment and only seconded it because he felt it was important to bring it to the floor so we could hear an explanation. He said many members of the Board have serious trust issues with the leadership of the Children's Home which he hoped was being heard, and he called the question.
