REGULAR SESSION

TUESDAY, APRIL 2, 2024

Chairman Johnson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and welcomed the students who were in attendance from the Cornell Cooperative Extension 4-H Student Government Program. Program Director Sabrina DeRue and Chairman Johnson presented each student with a certificate congratulating them on their achievement in completing the program.

ROLL CALL OF MEMBERS

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Sabrina DeRue, Program Director, Camp Wabasso and 4-H Student Government Program for Cornell Cooperative Extension Assoc. thanked the Board for their current and past support of the Student Government Program which she has been a part of since 2017; but has run annually since the early 1980's (except 2020). She said there were 27 high school junior and senior local students, including 12 exchange students, in the program this year and she thanked them and their families for their participation in the program. She said the kids were especially engaged this year in this hands on, immersive government experience.

Oliver Northrip, (she/her) Watertown City School District and 4-H Student Government Program participant appreciated the Board's support of the Program as it gives students from all over the chance to come together and learn about government.

Alae Kallat, (he/him), an exchange student from Morocco attending Carthage Central School District and 4-H Student Government Program participant, thanked the Board for their support of the Program as it gives students the opportunity to attend meetings and learn about the U.S. government. Through other volunteer opportunities at school he did 50 hours with the composting program, and observed that while the lunch system at school is built to provide a meal for each student, it generates a lot of food waste. He felt it was the right thing to do to point this out as it is part of the core values of the Student Government Program.

Chairman Johnson read a Proclamation and declared April as Fair Housing Month in Jefferson County recognizing the importance of the Fair Housing Act that provides the right to equal housing opportunities for everyone in the community.

Lance Evans, Executive Officer, Jefferson-Lewis Board of Realtors thanked the Board for its continued commitment to fair housing in the North Country, and said the Fair Housing Act of 1968 addressed housing discrimination in communities, and is critical to the ability of all real estate professionals to serve their clients, customers and communities. He said in New York State all realtors are required to take fair housing classes as part of their pre-licensing class and continuing education. The Jefferson-Lewis Board of Realtors is committed to ethically providing

an equal opportunity to all people seeking housing, and he thanked the Board for their continued affirmation over the years of the principles of fair housing. He said together we can ensure that all residents have access to affordable, barrier free housing.
