# You can become a certified Foster/Adoptive Parent!

- ✓ Are at least 21 years old
- ✓ Single, married, or living with a partner
- ✓ Have enough income to meet your own family's needs
- ✓ Are in good health
- ✓ Can make room in your home and heart for children who need safe, temporary care
- ✓ Be willing to complete 11 weeks of MAPP (Model Approach to Partnerships in Parenting) training
- Classes must be attended by husbands, wives and significant others in the home

#### **Required Documentation Includes:**

- Finger printing- all household members over 18 years old.
- NYS Child Abuse/Maltreatment Registry Clearance
- Reference from three friends or acquaintances
- Physicals for all adults
- > Home Inspection
- Completed Home study including information about finances, health, and family relationships
- Foster care application and other required forms for certification

Foster care is temporary care for children who are unable to live with their birth families.

### Support services Available

- ❖ YOU ARE NOT ALONE
- Agency staff or caseworkers are available to suggest and coordinate services as needed
- Foster parents receive a monthly rate for needs of the child
- Clothing allowances are provided for each child
- All medical, dental and pharmacy fees are paid by Medicaid
