The 1934 registration of 9670 in the City of Watertown and the 1934 vote of 19182 in the 22 towns of the county totaled the the enrollment of 28852 for the year 1935.

Because of the intense activity of the many candidates for nomination and election to the various offices and party positions, the Board of Elections acted upon approximately 600 applications for transfers of enrollment after moving, special enrollment on becoming of age, special enrollment because of naturalization and correction of errors in enrollment. This work necessitated nearly 2000 changes in the two enrollment book copies of the registers.

The work was greatly increased in this office, because of the adoption or the Primaries by the Republican voters in 16 towns of this county.

The work was greatly increased in this office, the Republicans in 16 towns abandoned the caucuses and because nominated their town officers in Republican Primaries.
