Central registration for voters was held from December 7, 1984 and continued through October 7, 1985, with 165 persons being registered centrally.

This office processed and approved 2,903 applications for registration and enrollment by mail forms during 1985.

1,355 applications for registration and enrollment forms were forwarded to schools in Jefferson County for registration of high school students who would be 18 years of age on election day. 813 completed forms were returned by the students. Additional forms were forwarded to town and village clerk's, public libraries, political parties and civic organizations.

Primary enrollment books were completed in February 1985 by the Jefferson County Printing Dept., containing 41,723 registered voters.

Enrollment tables are prepared after the publication of the primary books showing prior year registration by election district, total votes cast by election district for the November election and current enrollment by party and district.

Primary Election day was held on Tuesday, September 10, 1985, with voting hours from 12:00 Noon until 9:00 PM.
