INTRODUCTION

The Jefferson County Board of Elections conducts all National, State, County, and Town Elections. Although the Board of Elections is a county agency, its structures, responsibilities and duties are mandated by New York State election law, while its administrative procedures, directions, guidelines, rules and regulations are defined by the New York State Board of Elections.

Departmental Description

The board has a full-time staff of four employees with equal representation of Democrats and Republicans as mandated by New York State Election Law. The Board is administered by two part-time commissioners who serve a two-year term. The commissioners are elected by the County committee of each political party and their appointment is confirmed by the County Board of Legislators. The Commissioners each have a deputy who works full-time in the board office and runs the day to day operations of the office. The Deputy Commissioners are assisted by two full-time registration clerks, and two part-time employees.

The staff of the County Board of Elections provides the technical, clerical and mechanical skills necessary to provide services, information and statistical data to County Legislators, other departments, governmental agencies and the public. The Board conducts all Federal, State, County, Town and many of the Village elections in Jefferson County.





Jefferson County Board of Elections 2004 End of Year Report

We started in January with the usual cleaning up of files - throwing out what we could and packing up what we needed to keep. The registration clerks went through the entire voter files - active and inactive to put everything back in place. We had our two part time registration clerks - one from each party and they each worked two days a week. This gave us an extra person in the office four days a week to help us stay ahead of the game or at least stay even.

The Deputy Commissioners were going to go to Rye, NY for the Commissioners Conference. We had permission from our Administrator and we were able to use the county vehicle. Lewis County Commissioners were going to ride along with us. At the last minute the county vehicle went into the garage for major problems and we had no transportation. We ended up making the decision to stay home and hope we didn't miss any major changes. As it turned out nothing had been done about the HAVA laws which were our greatest concern, so we didn't really miss a lot.

March came upon us and we had a Democrat Primary to get ready for. This wasn't too bad as the majority of the "getting ready" falls upon the State Board of Elections. We still have to set up ballots, send out absentee applications, absentee ballots and answer many questions. It's always very busy through out this time.

Once the Primary was over and everyone knew who the candidates were our office started getting very busy. We found stacks of registration forms every day to be taken care of. We were very thankful for our extra help.

The deputy commissioners went to Saratoga Springs for the NYS Election Conference in June. The commissioners came down for one day. We still had no new information about the HAVA laws. Everyone is very concerned about this. New York State lawmakers need to make some changes in their laws to follow the criteria of the federal laws and until this happens the county boards can do nothing to prepare for the many changes that will have to take place. These changes were supposed to done by the 2004 general election but now we have until the 2006 election. The changes are going to take time to accomplish and we had hoped we could have a couple of years to get through the entire change. We truly hope we can have our new machines by the 2005 election so the general public will be able to use them before a state election.

We did start some changes made through the HAVA federal laws. If a person is a new registrant they must give their drivers license number or the last four digits of their social security number. If they register by mail they must put the number on the registration form and when they go to the polls to vote they have to show the election inspector proof of who they are. Everyone has been very helpful and we have had no real problems getting this information.

The fall primary was a very good one for our county. We had only one and that was a Republican Primary for a village trustee in the Village of Clayton. This took in two election districts. We were happy for this as we were busy enough without having to worry about a large

primary election.

Our election in November covered the federal and state offices plus a county family court judge, seven townships with a variety of offices and nine village elections.

November was coming fast and people were registering fast and furious. We had a feeling this was going to be a well turned out election. We felt each candidate had a very different way of looking at the presidential office and the people truly had a choice. Whenever this happens whether its on a local or national level the people tend to get to the polls and vote. Our office always enjoys it when we see a high percentage out to vote.

2004 Election Day was like no other. Some of the staff was in the office at 5:30 AM to be on hand in case there was problems at the poll before the opening (not enough workers or the machines aren't working) This wasn't the case this year. Our inspectors all showed up and there was no problems opening the machines. The telephones started ringing about 6:00 AM and the six telephones in the office were not quiet until after 9:00 PM. The minute you laid the telephone in the cradle it rang. There were no major problems throughout the day. People were calling to find out where they had to go to vote and inspectors were calling because they couldn't find a name in the book (usually the voter was in the wrong poll). Many polls had lines waiting to vote. This is unusual in our county but the people were not unhappy about it. We had several people come into the office to get a court order. We had a Supreme Court Judge in our office throughout the day and evening. The majority of these people were military who had just got back and didn't have time to send for an absentee ballot from their home state or just didn't think about it until they arrived back in the United States. The day was long, but the problems were few. The polls closed at 9:00 PM and at 9:50 PM every site had called in their final totals off of the machine and it was on the internet for all to see. We were very proud of our election inspectors as they did an outstanding job.

We had approximately 450 court orders for the 2004 election year. The majority of these were done on general election day when we had approximately 230 of them. This along with the telephone ringing non-stop gave us an interesting day.

Election Day is over and the work is not. It's time to check out all of the paper ballots before counting. We always match our absentee voters to the poll books before opening the ballots to make sure the voter didn't vote in person. We usually have 20 to 25 people who vote absentee and then find themselves in the county so they go to the poll to vote in person. These ballots are set aside so they don't get counted. There were 3,160 absentee ballots to be checked against the books. We then have affidavit ballots that we have to investigate before opening to make sure the person is registered to vote. This year we had 659 affidavit ballots. All of this takes time, but is well worth it when we do the actual count and know it has been done correctly.

Overall 2004 was a good year. We were kept busy but we had no major problems and for that we are thankful.

POSTAL PROGRAM:

Our postal program has been very standard for the last few years. We send 25 to 50 registration forms in January to every post office in the county with a letter explaining they must put these forms out where the public can have access to them. The majority of our voters who call and ask for a registration form are very happy when they are told the post offices have them. It's more convenient than waiting for one to be mailed or if they have to come in to the building to get one. We have been doing this long enough now that the post offices call us as soon as they see the forms getting low.

TOWN CLERKS - VILLAGE CLERKS - CITY CLERK - REALTORS - LIBRARIES

Registration forms are also sent to all of the above offices. The easier you make it for the potential voter to register the more apt they are to register. Half the battle is complete. Then you just have to find a way to make them want to go to the polls.

SCHOOL PROGRAM

Dates are set up for the registration clerks to go to the schools each year to register students. There are twelve schools and one college in Jefferson County. Almost all of the schools participate. When I set up the appointments for the clerks to go to the school, the teacher has the option of having them in their classroom or setting up a table in the hall just for registrations. I ask the school to make an announcement to the student so they will know ahead of time when we will be there. In the announcement the students are told they must be 18 years of age by election day, they must know their 911 address as well as their mailing address if different and we encourage them to talk to their parents about party enrollment. I have enclosed a copy of our "thank you" from one of the schools.

The Community College usually has two voter registration drives a year. We make sure they know all of the cutoff dates and they have enough forms on hand.

MEDIA:


We always work very closely with our television stations, newspapers, and radio stations. Whenever we want to get an announcement out about deadlines, voting dates, or anything pertaining to the election, our media has always been very helpful. The television stations come into the office a few times during the election period to remind people to vote. We do interviews on the radio and in the newspaper. The media and the board of elections both have an obligation to the general public and we have found a way for the two of us together to fulfill this obligation.

PRINT RESOURCES:

We give our posters to different organizations whenever they are going to have a registration drive. We use the brochures in the same way and we also pass them out to the students in the schools. It is very important to educate the public and brochures and posters are the most convenient way to do so.

ACTION PLAN 2005

We feel we will have a lot to do if the state changes some of their laws to meet the HAVA standards. New machines and the education of the public and the election workers are on the horizon. We don't know if it will happen in 2005 but we know we will be busy if it does. In the meantime, we will do as we have always done in the past - make voting as easy as possible for the general public and try to keep the public awareness of the importance of voting. This will be done through the media, schools, libraries, post offices, etc.
