MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE DEMOCRATIC COUNTY COMMITTEE OF THE COUNTY
OF JEFFERSON, AT THE COURT HOUSE IN THE CITY OF WATERTOWN AT 12 NOON ON THE
FOURTH DAY OF MARCH, 1912.

The Democratic County Committee for the County of Jefferson, convened at the Court House in the City of Watertown, at 12 o'clock noon, on the Fourth day of March, 1912, the time fixed pursuant to notice heretofore filed for the opening thereof.

The meeting was called to order by George R. Van Namee, Chairman of the Committee.

The roll of members was called by Gilbert S. Woolworth, Secretary of the Committee and the majority of the members of the said committee answered to their names.

A quorum being present the Committee proceeded to business.

The following resolution was offered by George S. McCartin and duly seconded:

RESOLVED: That the following rules and regulations be adopted as the rules and regulations of the Democratic County Committee of Jefferson County, New York.

Attached hereto and formed a part of these minutes is a certified copy of such rules and regulations.

The rules and regulations having been read by the Chairman and discussion being had thereon, the question was put and such rules and regulations were unanimously adopted.

Pursuant to the rules the Chairman, named Saturday March 30, 1912 at 12 o'clock noon, at the Court House, in the City of Watertown, N. Y. as the place for the meeting of the Committee for organization, subsequent to the primary day.

On motion the meeting adjourned.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE DEMOCRATIC
COUNTY COMMITTEE OF JEFFERSON COUNTY, NEW YORK.

The Democratic County Committee elected and established by the enrolled Democratic voters of the County of Jefferson do hereby adopt the following rules and regulations.

ARTICLE ONE.

REPRESENTATIVE BODIES.

The Democratic Organization of Jefferson County shall consist of

- FIRST: The County Committee to be known as the Democratic County Committee of Jefferson County, which shall be composed of as many County Committeemen from each Assembly District of the County as there are election Districts in such Assembly Districts.
- SECOND: An Assembly District Committee for each of the two Assembly Districts of Jefferson County. Each Assembly District Committee shall be composed of the members of the County Committee, resident within said district.
- THIRD. The Democratic City Committee of the City of Watertown, shall be composed on one member from each of the election districts within the said City of Watertown.
- FOURTH. The representation of Jefferson County in the Thirty fifth Senatorial District Committee, shall be composed of three members from each Assembly District to be designated by the Assembly District Committee.
- FIFTH: The representation of Jefferson County in the Fifth Judicial District Committee shall be composed of three members from each Assembly District to be designated by the Assembly District Committee.
- SIXTH: The representation of Jefferson County, in the Thirty second Congressional District Committee shall be composed of three members from each Assembly District to be designated by the Assembly District Committee.
- SEVENTH: Such conventions and other Committees as are prescribed by the Primary Election Law or as may be called or ~~appointed~~ ^{appointed} from time to time by the Democratic County Committee.
- EIGHTH: Each of the said Committees shall, pursuant to law, elect its own chairman, Secretary and Treasurer.

ARTICLE TWO.

UNIT OF REPRESENTATION.

FIRST: The unit of representation of the Democratic County Committee and all other committees representing any political division contained wholly within the county, shall be the Towns of the County and Wards of the City of Watertown.

SECOND: The unit of representation for the election of committees representing or held in or for the political division larger than the County of Jefferson shall be the Assembly District.

ARTICLE THREE.

TERMS AND DUTIES.

FIRST: The Democratic County Committee shall be the central organization of the Democratic Organization in the County of Jefferson and shall exercise and have general supervision, authority and control over all committees in the County and over each of the Assembly District Committees. The Members of the County Committee and of the various other committees shall be elected at the Fall Primaries, except, in a year when the Vice President and President of the United States are to be elected, the members of the County Committee and of the various other committees shall be elected at the Spring Primaries. The members of the various committees shall hold office for the term of two years.

SECOND: Vacancies in the membership of the County Committee shall be filled for the unexpired term by the remaining members of the Committee, at a meeting called by the Chairman, of the Committee in the same manner as meeting of the County Committee are called.

THIRD: The members of the County Committee shall meet on the Saturday following their election. The time and place of meeting shall be designated by the Chairman of the County Committee. The Committee shall elect a Chairman Secretary and Treasurer to serve until the election of a new County Committee.

ARTICLE FOUR.

OFFICERS

FIRST: The officers of the County Committee shall be a Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and such other officers as the Committee may elect, all of whom shall hold office until a new committee is elected and organized. *Persons not members of the Committee shall be eligible for election as officers.*

A person elected to the office of Secretary or Treasurer of the County Committee, who is not a member of the Committee at the time of his election to such position will not be entitled to vote in said Committee.

A person elected as Chairman of said Committee but who is not a member thereof shall not be entitled to vote, in said committee except in case of a tie. In that case he shall have only one vote.

SECOND: The Chairman of the County Committee shall preside at all meetings of that Committee and shall be ex-officio member of all Committees. He, or some duly appointed person, by him shall call to order all meetings, of the County Committee, and he may designate some person to act for him in the performance of his duties.

THIRD: The Secretary shall notify the members through the mail of the time and place of all meetings. He shall keep a true record of all proceedings at the meetings of the Committee, with a roll of the members and their respective place of address. He shall be custodian of all books, papers and all other property of the County Committee.

FOURTH: The Treasurer shall receive and hold in trust all funds of the County Committee, but no monies shall be paid by the Treasurer except by an order signed by the Chairman of the County Committee.

ARTICLE FIVE

MEETING OF COUNTY COMMITTEE.

FIRST: A meeting of the County Committee may be called at any time by the Chairman and shall be called at any time upon the presentation to the Chairman of the written request of the majority of the members of the Committee, which request shall state the ^{time} place and purpose of the proposed meeting.

SECOND: At least five days notice in writin shall be given to every member of any meeting. It shall be the duty of each member to deliver to the Secretary the address to which he desires official communication to be forwarded.

THIRD: The majority of the members of the Committee shall be necessary to form a quorum at any meeting, and no business shall be transacted at any meeting at whch there is not personally present or by proxy a majority of all the members of such committee.

FOURTH: No person shall act in the place of or represent any member of the Committee as his proxy unless there be filed with the Secretary of the Committee a written designation or authority signed by the member to be represented desginating said person by name as such proxy.

FIFTH. The meeting of the Committee shall be held in executive session on request of the majority of the members present at the meeting except otherwise provided by law.

ARTICLE SIX

ORDER OF BUSINESS AND RULES OF ORDER.

FIRSTS: The order of business at meetings shall be as follows:

1. Roll Call
2. Reading of minutes.
3. Report of Standing Committees.
4. Report of Special Committees.
5. Communications
6. Unfinished business.
7. Miscellaneous.

SECOND: Motion shall not be put or debated upon until seconded, and when seconded shall be stated by the presiding officer before debate.

THIRD: All Resolutions shall be reduced to writing and signed by the member offering same on the request of the presiding officer or any member of the Committee.

FOURTH: No member shall speak more than once on the same question to the exclusion of any other member, and no member shall speak more than ten minutes at a time without the consent of the Committee.

FIFTH: On any question the "ayes" and "Nays" shall be taken if requested by one-third of the members present, and entered on the minutes.

SIXTH: When the question has been stated the following motions and no other shall be entertained: to amend; to amend the amendment; to substitute; to lay on the table; to take the previous question; to adjourn; A motion to adjourn or to lay on the table shall be in order at any time; but such motion may not be renewed until there has been intervening business and shall be decided without debate.

SEVENTH: A motion to reconsider business disposed of shall not be entertained unless moved by a member voting with the majority or unless moved at the same time or the next meeting of the Committee.

EIGHTH: In all cases not provided in the foregoing ^{the} committee shall be governed by the rules as laid down in Cushing's Manual.

ARTICLE SEVEN

DESIGNATIONS.

FIRST: All candidates for nomination for elective officer and for election to party positions shall be designated by the Committee for the political sub-division for which the officer is to be elected, except that the members of the County Committee from each Assembly District, shall be designated by the Assembly District Committee. The Chairman of ^{the County} ~~each~~ committee shall fix the date when and the place where each committee shall meet for the purpose of making designations. The meetings of the Committees called for the purpose of making such designations shall be called to order by the Chairman and the following shall be the order of business.

1. Roll Call
2. Report of Standing Committees
- 3; Report of Special Committees.
- 4; Proposing names of candidates for designations.
5. Voting for candidates for designations.
- 6; Appointment of committees to fill vacancies in designation.
7. Unfinished business.
8. Miscellaneous business.

SECOND: In case but one name or group of names is proposed for designation as the candidate or candidates of the Committee, the Secretary may be ordered to cast the vote of the Committee for such candidate. In case more than one name or group of names is proposed for the designation, the roll of the Committee

shall be called and the person or persons receiving the largest number of votes shall be the person or persons designated by the Committee as the candidate for the elective office or party position. Each member of the committee shall to be entitled, but one vote.

THIRD: The Secretary shall prepare the certificates containing all the designations made by his committee and it shall be his duty forthwith to deliver all such certificates to the Secretary of the County Committee, by whom the same shall be filed.

FOURTH: Each Committee shall appoint a Committee composed of such number and appointed in such a manner as the Committee may direct for the purpose of filling any vacancies in designations as provided for in the Election Law.

FIFTH: The County Committee shall by a majority vote designate candidates for party nominations for all County Offices. Each Assembly District Committee shall designate candidates as follows:-

1. Members of the County Committee in number at least one to each Election District.
2. Members of the City Committee of the City of Watertown. At least one to each election district in the City of Watertown.
3. Members of the 35 Senatorial District Committee.
4. Three members of the 32nd Congressional District Committee.
5. Three members of the Judicial District Committee.
6. Members of the County Committee shall constitute the Assembly District Committee. Each members resident to be within each Assembly District

SIXTH: Candidates for town and village offices or party positions, shall continue to be nominated in the same manner as heretofore and at unofficial Primaries unless otherwise provided by the rules of the County Committee.

ARTICLE EIGHT.

FIRST: Any and all party rules heretofore adopted and existing, are hereby repealed.

SECOND: These rules and regulations may be amended in the manner prescribed by law.

- FOURTH: The representation of Jefferson County in the Thirty fifth Senatorial District Committee, shall be composed of three members from each Assembly District to be designated by the Assembly District Committee.
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- SEVENTH: Such conventions and other committees as are prescribed by the Primary Election Law, or as may be called or appointed from time to time by the Democratic County Committee.
- EIGHTH: Each of the said committees shall, pursuant to law, elect its

own Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer.

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UNIT OF REPRESENTATION.

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SECOND: Vacancies in the membership of the County Committee shall be filled for the unexpired term by the remaining members of the committee, at a meeting called by the chairman, of the committee in the same manner as a meeting of the County Committee is called.
