


The North Country gained 2,600 jobs, including 1,800 private sector jobs, over the past year.

The region's most significant industry is Government Regional Industry Mix, May 2022







Unemployment Rate by Place, May 2022




All of the largest labor force areas in the North Country Region had unemployment rates below the State's unemployment rate in May 2022.







US Census Bureau Diversity Index Scores, 2010 and 2020







Regional Labor Market Developments

Good news

Family-owned Harbor Freight plans to open a store in Ogdensburg in mid-summer, which will be their second location in St. Lawrence County. The company hires locally and chose the location because of its wide pool of qualified applicants. The store offers its customers a variety of quality air and power tools, storage, outdoor power equipment, generators, welding supplies, shop equipment and more, at low prices. In addition to employing construction workers, Harbor Freight will bring 25-30 new jobs to the Ogdensburg's community.

Nova Bus, a Quebec-based manufacturer, won a bid to deliver 135 40-foot transit buses for the MTA of New York City. The vehicles will be assembled at the manufacturer's facility in Plattsburgh (Clinton County). The deliveries are slated to begin in the fourth quarter of this year and be completed by the second quarter of 2023. The MTA, which is the largest transit equipment customer in the North America, singled out Nova Bus thanks to the company's exceptional network of suppliers, including many in Upstate New York, and an outstanding workforce.

The Bad Apple Garage Grill and Bar opened in a former oil change business in Watertown (Jefferson County). The establishment employs 15 workers and will offer hamburgers, sandwiches, appetizers and daily specials.

Update: Convalt Energy plans to make 460,000 solar panels at its planned manufacturing facility in Hounsfield (Jefferson County) for a solar project in the Southeast Asian country of Laos. The \$250 million solar project is slated to begin in June 2024. The company plans to break ground on the \$63 million solar manufacturing plant in Hounsfield in June-July of this year. With its headquarters in Watertown (Jefferson County), Convalt intends to employ 122 workers at the local plant in its first year and bring the total workforce up to 383 in year three.

Bad news

Claxton-Hepburn Medical Center (St. Lawrence County), Carthage Area Hospital and Meadowbrook Terrace Assisted Living (Jefferson County) face cuts of up to 4% of the workforce at each institution. The reasons for the workforce reductions are lower patient volumes caused by the pandemic, changing demographics and an evolving market, according to a joint news release from the medical institutions. The reductions are viewed as a measure of last resort to increase revenues and reduce costs to enable the hospitals to stay in their local communities.
