## **Resolution 21-13**

## Amendment of Local Definition of Requires Additional Assistance Barrier for In-School and Out-of-School Youth

Whereas, 681.220 final rules of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 states that an in-school youth (age 14-21) barrier is an individual who requires additional assistance to complete an educational program or to secure or hold employment,

Whereas, 681.210 final rules of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 states that an out-of-school youth (age 16-24) barrier is a low-income individual who requires additional assistance to enter or complete an educational program or to secure or hold employment,

**Therefore,** be it resolved that the Jefferson-Lewis Workforce Development Board adopts the following **revisions** of criterion and documentation requirements for the WIOA Youth Program "Requires Additional Assistance Barrier" for in-school and out-of-school youth:

Has repeated at least one grade level (ISY only)	verified by school, self-attestation/applicant statement
Has been referred to or is being treated by an agency for a	verified with referral documentation or treatment agency
substance abuse related problem or mental health issue	documentation
Has been, or is a victim of abuse, or resides in an abusive environment	as documented by a school official or professional
Has never held a job or is <b>not currently employed</b> : has had	never had a job: verified by self-attestation/applicant
3 interviews without begin hired in the past 3 months	statement
and/or a work search record with 10 activities and has	not currently employed: verified by a work search
been actively seeking employment for 3 months.	record/self-attestation/applicant statement
Has been fired from a job within the 12 months prior to	verified by self-attestation/applicant statement

Has never held a full-time job for more than 13 consecutive	verified by self-attestation/applicant statement
