Free Hepatitis C Testing Offered

April 17, 2019, Watertown, NY— Anyone can be tested for Hepatitis C, but the Jefferson County Public Health Service especially recommends testing for those born between 1945 and 1965 because they are 5 times more likely to be infected. Also at risk are those who had a blood transfusion or a blood product like Rhogam before 1992, obtained a tattoo outside of a licensed facility, or injected or snorted drugs — even only once. In addition, men who have ever had sex with men should be tested.

Millions of Americans are infected; many do not even know it. The Hepatitis C virus attacks the liver. People with Hepatitis C often have no symptoms. Many people can live with an infection for decades without feeling sick. If left undiagnosed and untreated, Hepatitis C can lead to serious liver disease such as cirrhosis, liver failure and liver cancer.

As part of Hepatitis Awareness Month, the JCPHS will be offering by appointment free Hepatitis C testing on May 6th, 12-4pm at 531 Meade Street, Watertown. Appointments can be made at www.icphs.org

Hepatitis C can be treated. New and more effective treatments can cure more than 90% of cases in as little as 12 weeks. All individuals who test positive will receive educational materials and be referred for treatment. If you have any questions, please call 315-786-3720.
