Jefferson County, NY COVID-19 Monthly Index June 2022

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June Monthly Index:

Attached, please find the June 2022 Jefferson County, NY COVID-19 Monthly Index. Components of the index include vaccination data, testing data, COVID-19 community level designated by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control, wastewater results, hospital discharge data, and mortality data. For June, numbers of people vaccinated increased slightly. Case rate/100,000 decreased. Hospital discharges decreased to 53. Community level is LOW. Wastewater results remain at HIGH for the City of Watertown and the Village of Carthage/West Carthage. While community level, reported positive tests, case rate, and hospitalizations are lower than in prior months, high City of Watertown and Village of Carthage/West Carthage wastewater results indicate active but lower severity of disease at this time. There was 1 COVID-19 death in June; the graphic of deaths with vaccination status in this month's index includes all that occurred in 2022.

Vaccine:

Because vaccine efficacy is waning, risk for contracting COVID-19 increases in fully vaccinated individuals. Visit <https://covid19vaccine.health.ny.gov/booster-doses> to learn about first and second dose booster eligibility and updates for residents of New York State, as well as additional doses for immunocompromised individuals.

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control is now recommending that everyone ages 6 months and older in the United States receive a COVID-19 primary series vaccination for the prevention of COVID-19. Effective June 18, 2022, children ages 6 months through 4 years of age became approved to receive COVID-19 vaccinations.

To begin protecting young children, the Jefferson County Public Health Service will hold two COVID vaccination clinics as follows:

First Clinic – Moderna Vaccine:

Date: Thursday, 7/7/2022

Time: 11:00 AM – 1:00 PM

Location: Jefferson County Public Health Service, 531 Meade Street, Watertown

Moderna vaccine (two shot series 28 days apart) will be offered for children ages 6 months through 5 years old. Second shots will be given on 8/4/2022; appointments for the second dose will be scheduled at the 7/7/2022 clinic.

Second Clinic – Pfizer Vaccine:

Date: Thursday, 7/7/2022

Time: 1:30 PM – 3:30 PM

Location: Jefferson County Public Health Service, 531 Meade Street, Watertown

Pfizer vaccine (three shot series) will be offered for children ages 6 months through 4 years old. Second shots will be given on 7/28/2022; appointments for the second dose will be scheduled at the 7/7/2022 clinic. *Third shots will be 8 weeks later, clinic date and time to be determined.*

Please register for one of the clinics on 7/7/2022 via the Jefferson County Public Health Service webpage at www.jcphs.org. Click the COVID Vaccination tab to register for either the Moderna or Pfizer clinic as instructed.

Testing/Isolation/Quarantine:

If you need to be tested for COVID-19, you may use a home test, or visit <https://coronavirus.health.ny.gov/find-test-site-near-you> to find a testing site near you. If you have COVID-19 symptoms, please stay home. Do not go to work. Do not attend school. Avoid all public areas. Visit <https://co.jefferson.ny.us/departments/PublicHealth/IsolationQuarantine> for home isolation and quarantine information.

Jefferson County, NY COVID-19 Community Level: **LOW**

COVID-19 Community Level is a new rating based on new COVID-19 cases per 100,000 population (7-day total), new COVID-19 hospital admissions per 100,000 population (7-day total), and percent of hospital inpatient beds occupied by COVID-19 patients (7-day average).

Wastewater Results:

SARS-CoV-2 City of Watertown, Wastewater Testing Result, as of 6/28/2022: **HIGH**

SARS-CoV-2 Village of Carthage/West Carthage, Wastewater Testing Result, as of 6/16/2022: **HIGH**

SARS-CoV-2 Thousand Islands Central School District, Wastewater Testing Result, as of 6/30/2022: **LOW**

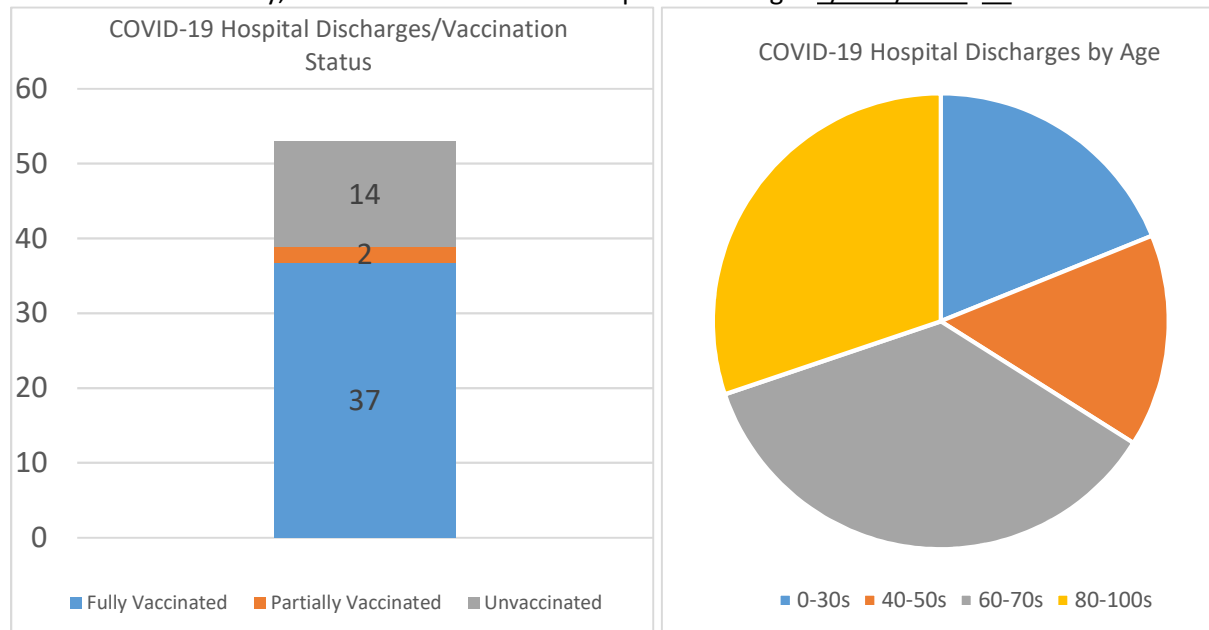
HIGH = COVID-19 quantifiable indicating active transmission with remediation needed immediately.

LOW = COVID-19 detected but not quantifiable indicating early/latent infection or a potential outbreak depending on the size of the sewer shed.

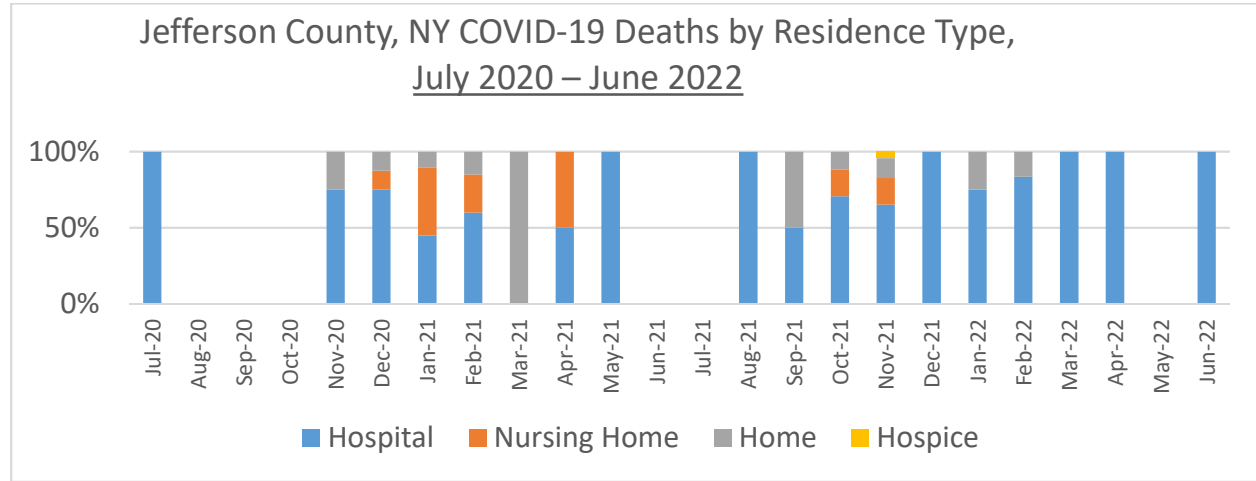

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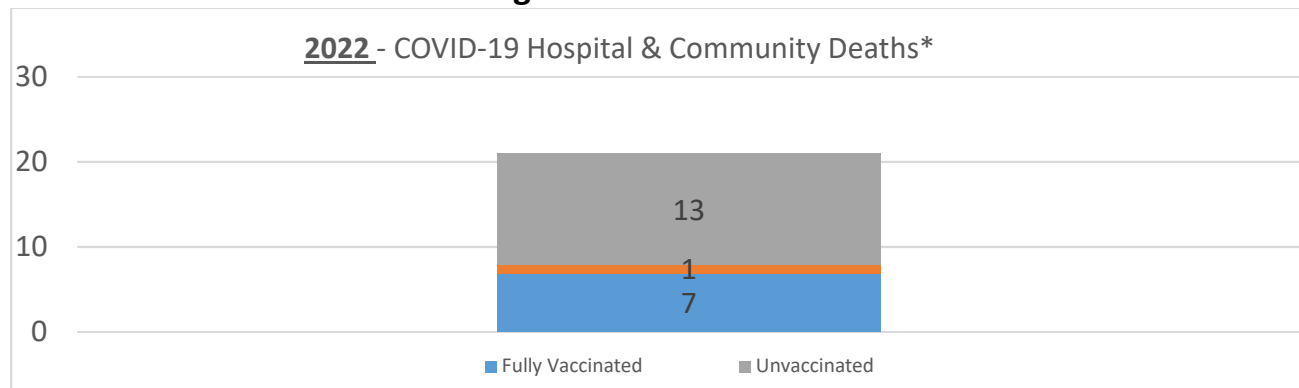
