Jefferson County, NY COVID-19 Monthly Index April 2022

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April Monthly Index:

Attached, please find the April 2022 Jefferson County, NY COVID-19 Monthly Index. Components of the index include vaccination data, testing data, COVID-19 community level designated by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control, wastewater results, hospital discharge data, and mortality data. This month's report continues to delineate mortality data from the beginning of the pandemic to present, as well as a graphic of April 2022 hospital and community deaths due to COVID-19 and vaccination status of the decedents. It is important to note that 1 unvaccinated individual that died of COVID-19 in April had significant preexisting conditions. Additionally, 1 unvaccinated individual that died of COVID-19 in April had no significant pre-existing conditions. No vaccinated individuals died of COVID-19 in April.

Vaccine:

Because vaccine efficacy is waning, risk for contracting COVID-19 increases in fully vaccinated individuals. Testing/Isolation/Quarantine:

If you have COVID-19 symptoms, please stay home. Do not go to work. Do not attend school. Avoid all public areas. SARS-CoV-2 Thousand Islands Central School District, Wastewater Testing Result, as of 4/28/2022: HIGH


HIGH = COVID-19 quantifiable indicating active transmission with remediation needed immediately.




